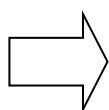


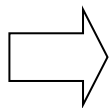
Kobe Municipal Schools offers Junior High School Night-Schooling

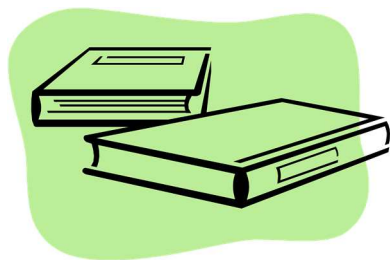

1. What are class times?

Classes are held on weekdays from around 17:30 until 21:00. There are four 40 minute classes everyday.
